• Size

- o Medium-size Colorado libraries are "just right" for Marmot
- o Large Colorado libraries (Denver, JeffCo, CSU, etc.) have their own ILS
 - Most are in Prospector
 - All are Pika prospects
- o Small Colorado libraries use AspenCat AND Pika
 - 44 publics include Alamosa, Dolores County, Dolores, Mancos, Nederland, Norwood, Ouray, Silverton, West Routt/Hayden
 - 3 academics include CC Aurora, Red Rocks CC, Regis University
 - 26 school districts include Crested Butte, Gunnison, Silverton, West End/Naturita

 - o Colorado for Union Catalog members
 - Western Slope for IT Service subscribers
 - United States for Discovery Partners
- New members 2009-2015
 - o 5 publics: Salida, Englewood, Rampart, Buena Vista, Pine River

2. Marmot Services


- Substantial Union Catalog (1.8M works) & shared ILS (Sierra by Innovative)
 - o All 27 members use
 - o Optional integration with Prospector & MOBIUS
 - o Primary focus of User Services team managed by Brandon Cole
- Cost-effective IT services
 - o 11 members subscribe
 - o 1,124 workstations, 22 servers, 52 wireless access points, Internet service (58 circuits for 30 sites), E-Rate, etc.
 - o Primary focus of IT Services team managed by Sean Hanson
- Excellent Discovery Layer (Pika by Marmot)
 - o All 27 members plus 6 Discovery Partners use and help develop
 - Primary focus of Research & Development (R&D) team managed by Mark Noble
- Nascent Digital Archive
 - o Development in 2016 is focused on Digital Archive program


4. Pricing Principles

- Sierra and all "included" services
 - Pricing is largely based on staff sessions
 - o SIP2 and a few other options are priced separately
 - Most inappropriate subsidies have been eliminated
 - o Alternative pricing based on standard metrics was rejected in 2013
- IT services
 - Optional fee-based services for full members
 - Pricing is based on counts of workstations, servers, wireless access points, and DSL circuits
 - Broadband pricing needs overhaul for new technologies and E-Rate
- Pika
 - Included for full members
 - Discovery Partner income pays for 2nd developer
- Digital Archive pricing in 2016 based on session counts of 12 members in Cohort 1, but this should be rethought for 2017



5. Budget and Pricing Governance

- June Marmot Director and management team draft budget & pricing
- July Finance Committee reviews and recommends
 - o Directors are invited to comment on posted drafts
- August Marmot Board reviews and approves
- September Marmot Director announces budget and prices to Director

7. Benefits and Responsibilities of Membership

Public, academic, and school libraries formed the Marmot Library Network in 1985 primarily to afford an integrated library system (ILS). When Marmot implemented patron-initiated system holds and a shared OverDrive collection in 2006, the object of sharing began to shift from ILS costs to library collections. And when Marmot joined Prospector in 2010, the primary reason to join (or remain part of) Marmot was not the ILS but a Union Catalog facilitating collection sharing.

Benefits

- Robust resource sharing among 27 members
- Competitive ILS functionality (Sierra)
- Excellent online catalog (Pika)
- o Talent sharing in committees and task forces

- o Shared e-collections: OverDrive and Zinio
- o IT Service options (IT expertise benefits all members)
- Optional resource sharing with Prospector (CO, WY)
- Optional resource sharing with MOBIUS (MO)
- Responsibilities
 - Follow Union Catalog standards
 - Share most physical resources
 - o Participate in committees and task forces
 - o Pay bills in a timely fashion

8. Strategies for Growth and Retention

- Marketing & sales efforts are limited to reputation, word-of-mouth, and conscientious responses to requests
 - o One email campaign in 2010 has not been repeated
 - o Ongoing conversations with prospects can take years to consummate
 - o 30 prospects received price quotes and follow-up from 2009 to 2015
- Member retention is due to great service at reasonable prices
 - o Price reductions in 2010 and 2011
 - o Fair cost-sharing models
 - Excellent new employees
