

Assigning Subject Headings

Identify

Topics (not specific subject headings at this point) Names of persons, corporate bodies, geographic areas Time periods

Titles of works

Form/Genre

Form - what it is, rather than what it is about

Genre - works with a common theme, setting, etc.

Objectivity

Consider the author's intent and the audience

Avoid personal value judgments

Translating Topics into Headings

Usually one to six subject headings

Assign the most specific heading that matches the topic

Consider broader and narrower terms and subdivisions

Look at headings assigned to similar works

Scan

Title page, table of contents, preface, introduction, text, bibliography, index, dust jacket, container, label, title screen

Look for

Key words that describe what the resource is about; the form of the item; the author's intent, audience, viewpoint

Ask yourself

What is this resource about? Is there one topic or several? If several, are they treated in relation to each other? Is there a focus on a particular place, time, or person? Mentally compose a statement

"This resource is about..."
